**Summer Sermon Series: Creed, Week 4**  
***Suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died and was buried.***  
**“He Took Our Place”**  
**John 19:18-20; Hebrews 2:9-18**

The cross has become the epitome of God’s love.

God calls us to be holy as he is holy. God wants us to have a relationship with him, but our sin gets in the way.

Now, in Jesus Christ, God’s grace provides the payment for our sin. God provides a way for us to come to him, free from sin.

Romans 6:23 declares that "the wages of sin is death." We deserve to die for our sin, but God has allowed His Son to die in our place instead.

Not only did Jesus die to save us from our sin, he died to save us from the power of sin and death.

Jesus came face to face with the powers of darkness and he did not give in – he triumphed! Jesus reversed the curse of original sin. Because the first Adam sinned, only another human could save us – the perfect Lamb of God, Jesus.

Pontius Pilate was a real person in human history who stood in opposition to God’s will and in so doing unwittingly aligned himself with the evil forces of this world.

Jesus was buried. Pilate would not have delivered his body to be buried, until he was well assured that Jesus was really dead.

There is nothing that we can do to take away (atone) for our sin. However, Jesus took your place; he took my place; he took our place on the cross. Jesus died for us that we might life for him.
