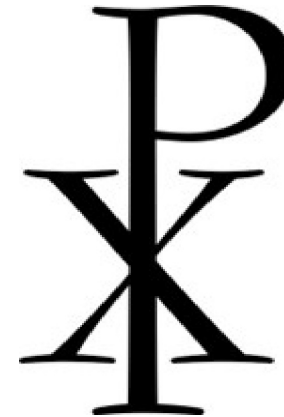

Chi Rho



IHS

In Greek, chi and rho are the first two letters of Christ superimposed upon one another.
The Chi Rho was one of the first Christograms
(a combination of letters that form an abbreviation for the name of Jesus Christ).
Another popular Christogram is IHS
(a monogram of the Holy Name), derived from the Greek referring to:
Iesus Hominum Salvator = Jesus Savior of humanity

He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty.

From there, He shall come to judge the living and the dead.

"The King Has One More Move"

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Hebrews 1:3; 10:10-14, 19-23

Jesus ascended and is quite active and the author of the book of Hebrews tells us three things we need to know about the ascended Lord. Jesus is our priest, he is a prophet and our king. Jesus fulfills all the roles of the Messiah.

Jesus is seated on a throne in heaven at the right hand of the Father. In ancient times, the right hand was the place of great honor. To be seated on the throne speaks to the power that Jesus has.

Jesus is actively involved in the affairs of the universe. Jesus rules and reigns with the full power of God.

There is a point in human history when Jesus will return - and we will all see him coming back.

The Greek word used here to describe the return of Christ is "parousia" - which means "glorious appearance."

God will bring judgment against the wicked and evil aspects of this world. God's judgement will be just and we can trust in God's perfect judgment.

The Day of Judgment will be a day of joy, because our sins have already been paid for by the blood of Jesus. We can have peace in knowing that one day Jesus will return in victory, and God will set everything right.
