## “Methodism: Who Are We?”

"Methodism: Who Are We?"

John 15:1-11; Ephesians 2:1-10

The founders of Methodism: John Wesley and his brother Charles. John Wesley was born on June 28th 1703.

Oxford: John was a Fellow and ordained. Charles formed what they called a "Holy Club." Later called "Methodist" for the way that they lived this disciplined life.

1735 the brothers Wesley sailed to Georgia in the American colonies. Wesley wrote in his journal of his time there, "I have saved the Indians, but who shall save me?" Wesley had no assurance of his own salvation. The Wesley brothers returned to England believing their lives and ministry had failed.

John was almost in despair. He did not have the faith to continue to preach. Böhler counseled otherwise. "Preach faith till you have it," he advised. "And then because you have it, you will preach faith."

On May 24, 1738 - Aldersgate "I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation, and an assurance was given me, that he had taken away my sins, even mine and saved me from the law of sin and death."

Wesley realized that God loved him unconditionally, he no longer tried to earn his salvation out of fear, instead he sought to live a holy life in response to God's great sacrificial love.

John Wesley believed in being connected and part of early Methodism was a requirement to be in a small group, or what they called bands. What grew the Methodists as individuals and as a society was the fact that they met regularly.

The Wesley brothers knew that the key to growing spiritual is remaining connected. We need to remain connected to Jesus first and foremost. Jesus told us to "Remain in me, and I will remain in you."

Jesus said, "I have said these things to you so that my joy will be in you and your joy will be complete."
